#### GOSPEL ACCLAMATION


Alleluia, alleluia!

# **Weekly Reflection**

It seems fitting that the Church has dedicated 1 January to the woman who herself knew only too well that "nothing is impossible with God." On this day, we honour Mary, the Mother of God, the mother of all possibilities, the mother of our salvation, the mother of all hope.

The Solemnity of Mary is a timeless celebration that speaks to us powerfully in the 21st century. In a world filled with distractions, noise, and division, this feast calls us to pause and reflect on the profound mystery of God choosing to enter the world through the humble and obedient heart of Mary. Her "yes" to God wasn't just a historical moment –it's a model of faith, trust, and surrender that remains relevant today.

Despite our busy lives, and as we honour Mary, we are invited to renew our commitment to living with faith, humility, and a deep trust in God's plan for our lives.

On another note, this weekend, the church also celebrates the Epiphany of our Lord. This is the moment Christ is revealed to the world. The Magi, guided by a star, teach us how to seek God with faith and perseverance. They recognize Jesus not in power or wealth, but in humility, reminding us that God often comes to us in simple and unexpected ways.

When the Magi bow in adoration, they show that true wisdom leads to worship. After encountering Christ, they return home by a different path – signifying that no one meets Jesus and remains the same. The Epiphany calls us to follow Christ's light, adore Him sincerely, and carry His presence into our daily lives.
