DO SOMETHING SUNDAY FOCUS FOR OCTOBER

Rather than focus on all the weekends of the month, our 'Do Something Sunday' focus for October will be centred on the weekend of 21-22 October that is designated as 'World Mission Sunday'. We have been informed by Catholic Mission that the funds raised this year by Australian Parishes like ours will be directed towards the Church's work in Timor-Leste.

On the weekend of 14-15 October, a week before our Mission Appeal, special envelopes will be available at the Welcome Table which can be placed on either collection basket on the weekend of 21-22 October. Alternatively, you can make a 'cashless' contribution via this link.



Tuberculosis, malnutrition and maternal mortality are conditions all too familiar for the people of Timor-Leste. In two weeks' time you will learn about the work of the Salesian Sisters, including nurse, Sister Carolina, who desires to see better outcomes for her community. We will also share the story of Petrolina and her daughter's desperate need for medical attention.

You have the opportunity to partner with this life-giving work, and your prayers and generosity are crucial in ensuring this program can continue.

This opportunity is a great way to commit to the missionary movement, as He reminds us in Luke 24:13-35, the fire of Christ burns within us and encourages us to take action for those in most need.

Sharing the sacred land of the Dharawal people, the parish of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop at Leppington and Oran Park is a family of diverse families.



ADULT FAITH FORMATION "FAITH NIGHT" Friday 24 November | 7pm - 8.30pm

As a parish we are truly blessed that every Sunday a 'Chaldean Holy Mass' is celebrated in our Oran Park Church. The Chaldean Catholic Church is an Eastern Catholic particular church that is in full communion with the Holy See and the rest of the Catholic Church, and traces back to St Thomas the Apostle. Pope St John Paul II famously wrote in his 1995 encyclical letter 'Ut Unum Sint' (Latin: 'That they may be one') that the Church needs to breathe with both of its lungs again: the Church in the East and in the West. The Church is stronger with the East and the West together since they complement each other in such brilliant and beautiful ways.

Our November Faith Night will be an opportunity to 'breathe with these two lungs' and to learn more about the Catholic Churches of the East, especially the Chaldean Catholic Church that is now part of the story of our parish. Our guest speaker at our next Faith Night will be Archbishop Amel Nona DD. Archbishop Nona is the Archbishop of the Chaldean Catholic Diocese of Australia and New Zealand, and prior to this he was the Chaldean Catholic Archbishop of Mosul in the northern part of Iraq. Following a time for prayer and Archbishop Nona's reflection, there will be a time of conversation with other Faith Night attendees, along with Q&A. The evening will conclude with supper. Our November FAITH NIGHT will be held in the Oran Park Church.

It is essential, for catering purposes, to RSVP if you are planning to attend this 'Faith Night' RSVP to oranpark@dow.org.au no later than Friday 17th November.

These 'Faith Nights' coincide with one of the goals in our 2023-2024 Parish Pastoral Plan, which focuses on opportunities for 'Adult Faith Formation', and offer an opportunity for prayer, reflection and conversation.
