

UPDATE ON PARISH COMMUNITY GARDEN RECONSTRUCTION

As many would be aware, all organic material from the St Mary Mackillop Community Garden had to be removed, and the site remediated, after a proactive site test of the garden detected a small quantity of bonded asbestos in the mulch. As a result of this, all mulch and plants and soil from the site was removed, and following this work we received clearance and air monitoring certificates, which have deemed the garden safe for use. You are invited to assist with the reconstruction of the parish community garden, which we hope will be completed in the coming months.

Our bi-monthly 'Do Something Sunday' focus for May-June will be focused on the sharing of our time, talents and resources to re-establish the garden.

The Parish Community Garden Team envision that we will be able to quickly re-establish the garden with our community support and they are thankful for all community members who have already offered to assist in a variety of different ways.

Just a reminder that our Parish and the Macarthur Social Justice Network (MSJN) will be co-hosting a Workshop in the Penola Room (next to our Oran Park Church) on Saturday 4th May from2pm – 3.30pm, followed by afternoon tea.

The workshop will be led by Sean Donovan, Secretary of MSJN and former chair of Wollongong Diocese Justice Ecology and Peace Council, who will give an Introduction to Catholic Social Teaching. Catholic Social Teaching is the Church's body of principles and values that guide us in our response to the social issues of our time. It is based on the Gospel message of Jesus and the teachings of the popes and bishops. The presentation is ideal starter for anyone new to Catholic Social Teaching or as a refresher for people who have been involved in the past. Sean will provide an overview of the key concepts and principles of Catholic Social Teaching. There will be time for refreshments, meeting others and discussion.

One of the hopes following this meeting, is that some people who attend might like to come together to form our own 'Parish Social Justice Group' here in the Parish.

CLOTHING DONATION BIN NOW LOCATED AT ORAN PARK CHURCH

As Pope Francis has reminded us, we need to care for the environment in a serious and effective manner, and recycling is one important means to this end.

We are pleased to announce that our parish have partnered with Australia's largest collector of textiles for re-use, re-purpose, and recycling, SCR Group to make a clothing donation bin once again available next to the Oran Park Mass Centre.

As clearly shown on the graphic that is found on the front of the donation bin - the only items that can be placed in the SCRGroup donation bin are clothing, shoes, handbags and fashion accessories. Those wishing to donate other items (such as toys or household items) are asked to drop these off at charity stores and other charity providers.

CHANGES TO PARKING ARRANGEMENTS IN PRECINCT CARPARK DURING TERM 2

In consultation with the St Justin's Leadership Team, Fr David, Mrs Kerrie Piatek (Principal of St Benedict's College) and representatives from the St Justin's parent community, St Justin's commenced a review of their afternoon dismissal procedures. As the safety of both school communities - students, staff, parents, grandparents – along with the Parish and members of the wider community is a priority, and to ensure an effective, functional and practical afternoon parent pickup in mind, St Justin's, with the support of the Parish, will be trialling new procedures for Term 2.

These procedures will be reviewed at the end of Term 2 2024, where St Justin's will be seeking feedback from the school and Parish community.
