Sharing the sacred land of the Dharawal people, the parish of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop at Leppington and Oran Park is a family of diverse families.

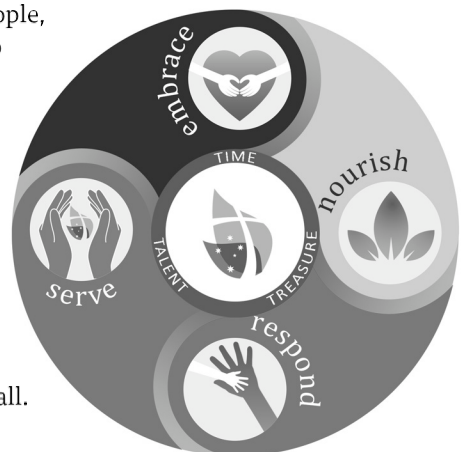
We are sustained by the **Sacraments** and nurtured in our faith in **Jesus Christ**.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF CHILDREN FOR CHILDREN WHO ARE NOT BAPTISED CATHOLIC

Children 7 years and above who are not baptised or who have been baptised in a Christian church other than Catholic, are still able to make their First Reconciliation and/or First Holy Communion, by taking part in a 4-week preparation process – prior to the start of a 1st Reconciliation/1st Holy Communion program. This preparation process, sometimes called the Rite of Christian Initiation of Children (RCIC) will be an opportunity for these children supported by their adult family members to ‘meet in small groups’ before or after a weekend Mass, to learn more about what it means to be a Catholic-Christian and to prepare for their Baptism (or for those already baptised in another Christian church, their ‘Reception into the Catholic Church’). Children who journey through RCIC (and have completed the 4 week RCIC program along with the 1st Reconciliation/1st Holy Communion program) will, as set down by liturgical practice, receive their Baptism/Reception into the Catholic Church, 1st Holy Communion and Confirmation all during the one Mass. (The RCIC Mass for 2023 will be held on Tuesday 13th June at the regular 7pm evening Parish Mass). Those interested in being a part of RCIC are asked to send an email to oranparksacraments@dow.org.au no later than **19 February 2023**.

In addition to its consultative role, the Bishop requires the approval of a Parish Finance Council for construction and major expenditures.

In particular we are looking for people who have professional knowledge in the area of accounting, are committed to the work and vision of the parish and participate in regular weekend Mass.

Lenten Program 2023

Did you know LENT begins on 22 February – Ash Wednesday?

In response to one of the goals in our 2023 Parish Pastoral Plan, that focuses on encouraging parishioners to meet in small groups, this year we are inviting everyone to participate in a Lenten Group.



What happens in a Lenten Group? It is an opportunity, as a member of our parish, to gather 'in small groups' to reflect on the Lenten scriptures for the coming weekend, to share your faith, to pray and to 'get to know' fellow parishioners outside the context of the weekly Mass. A session goes for about 90 mins, and groups usually finish with a cuppa or supper (provided by the participants who are encouraged to bring something to share). We are looking at running a number of Lenten Groups: including (but not limited to) groups that are held in the sacristy at our northern Mass centre at St Mary Mother of God, Leppington, or one of the meeting rooms at our southern Mass centre at Oran Park as well as groups just for the men of the parish, the women of the parish, young married couples, senior parishioners, those in their 20s/30s et al.

We are now on the look-out for those who may be interested in being a host or a facilitator – if you would like to assist you are asked to write your name, contact details and the day of the week and time when you would like your group to meet on the sheet available at the Welcome Table. You are also asked to indicate if you wish to be a host and/or facilitator – and if you have a specific group you wish to host/facilitate, as well as if you want to suggest a venue for the group. (We hope to finalise all group hosts and facilitators over the next few weeks, so we can then ask people to sign up to participate in a group)
