WHAT REMAINS AFTER FORTY DAYS

As Lent approaches, there is a quiet temptation to make our sacrifices visible. We speak of what we have given up, how difficult it feels, how tired we look, or how much more present we have been at church. Yet the Gospel gently unsettles this instinct. Jesus reminds us, "And whenever you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites" (Matthew 6:16). Lent is not meant to draw attention to our effort. It is an interior season, largely unseen, where the real work takes place between the human heart and God.

The disciplines of Lent are not about endurance for its own sake. They exist to prepare us for conversion. In one of his final public messages, Pope Francis described Lent as a time to examine whether we are truly on a journey of faith, asking whether we are "seeking ways to leave behind the occasions of sin and situations that degrade our dignity" (Message for Lent, 2025).

Often, the most faithful Lenten journey is the least noticeable. Some may not appear especially devout, yet something within them has changed. They listen more patiently, judge less quickly, and choose mercy more readily. Their fasting has softened them, and their prayer has shaped how they live.

Lent, then, is less about forty days endured and more about who we become beyond them. The ashes fade, but the invitation remains.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Of all the pious exercises connected with the Fridays of Lent, none is more popular than the Via Crucis (Stations of the Cross). You are invited to gather at **6pm at our Oran Park or Leppington Church on each of the Fridays of Lent (beginning 20 February)**

LENTEN GROUPS are an opportunity, as a member of our Parish, to gather 'in small groups' to reflect on the Lenten scriptures for the coming weekend, to share your faith to pray and to 'get to know' fellow parishioners outside the context of the weekly Mass. LENTEN PENANCE & OBLIGATIONS : The Church's Canon Law reaffirms our obligation to do penance. The special times of penance are all Fridays throughout the year, Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and the season of Lent. Please visit the Notice Board for more information.

To allow as many Parishioners as possible to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession), we will be holding the following extended sessions of Reconciliation at our Oran Park Church:

Tue, 24 March : 5pm-6.45pm

Sat, 28 March : 4pm-4.45pm.

Tue, 31 March : 5pm-6.45pm.

On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, all who are 14 years or older are obliged to abstain from meat. All who are 18 to 59 are obliged to fast (Canon 1252). Pastors, teachers and parents are to ensure that, even those who by reason of their age are not bound by the law of fasting and abstinence from meat, are taught the true meaning of penance

PASCHAL PRECEPT : Each of the faithful is obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. This is to be done between Ash Wednesday (18 Feb) and Trinity Sunday (31 May), unless it is done at another time during the year. All the faithful are obliged to confess their grave sins at least once a year.

EASTER VIGIL CANDLES: Each year, as part of our Easter Vigil Mass, we begin our service with the Ritual of Light. The Church itself is dark, as dark as that night when Jesus lay in the tomb. The ritual begins outside the Church with the lighting of the Paschal fire. The flame is then transferred into the Church via the Paschal Candle. As the priest processes through the darkened Church with the candle, he sings "Christ our Light" three times to which the congregation responds "Thanks be to God". This year, we would again like to encourage each and every parishioner who will be attending the Easter Vigil Mass to purchase a candle from our Parish Piety Stall to be fully immersed in this celebration. Candles are \$2 each or 3 for \$5.
