Weekly Reflection


If anyone had the opportunity to visit the Holy Land, a very memorable site is Bethany Beyond the Jordan, just north of the Dead Sea. This is where Jesus was baptised.

Nearby is the cave of John the Baptist. You can also see the ruins of an ancient church and what is left of a monastery, dating back to the 4th and 5th centuries. To stand there is to see the very beginnings of Christianity. Every one of us who is baptised can trace our lineage back to that shallow river, to the place where Jesus himself was baptised and where He began his public ministry. Sacred scripture tells us it was this place where John the Baptist saw Jesus approaching and cried out, "Behold, the Lamb of God!" John the Baptist spoke those words in an unlikely place, but he pointed the way to a wondrous mystery.

We hear those words at every Mass. This is when we celebrate the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist – we need to hear those words as if we are hearing them for the first time. As we come forward at Communion to receive Jesus and when we are offered the Body of Christ, we whisper "Amen." This is the most meaningful word of our faith. The experience of receiving communion at Mass makes us "living tabernacles" of God's presence, bringing him into the world through our lives.

And in our hands, we hold the saviour of the world. So as we prepare to receive the Eucharist, we come before the Lord as sinful people, and pray "Lord I am not worthy" – but we also pray that He will only say the word and our souls will be healed.



SAINTS OF THE WEEK

SAINT AGNES (-304)



As with so many of the early Roman martyrs, very little is now known about Agnes' life. Partly this is because the details have been obscured by the light that shines from her martyrdom and the cult that it inspired, and partly because if you are martyred at the age of 12, your life has not really acquired that many details in any case. Agnes was filled with the love of God from an early age, vowed herself to celibacy, and when the opportunity of martyrdom arose, she did not hide away but stepped forward and took it.

That is really all that is known: but it is enough. We who are used to compromising with the world at every turn, and would find excuses to avoid any inconveniences that our faith might cause us, let alone martyrdom ("yes, of course I would die for my faith in principle, but wouldn't I be able to do more good in the long run if I stayed alive just now?"), should admire the simple wisdom of Agnes, realise that there are moments where compromise and moral ambiguity just will not do, and pray for the strength to live up to such moments when they happen.
