GOSPEL Luke 18:1-8 The parable of the unjust judge





In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the persistent widow who continuously pleads for justice from an unjust judge. Her relentless approach, despite the judge's indifference, eventually moves him to act, not because of his own compassion, but because of her unwavering persistence. This passage teaches us about the power of persistence in prayer, the importance of trust in God's justice, and the need to remain faithful even when the answers are delayed.


The widow's persistence mirrors how we are called to approach God. Like her, we often pray for justice, healing, or guidance and may feel discouraged when we don't immediately see results. But Jesus encourages us to be persistent in our prayers, trusting that God hears us even when the answer is not immediate. Our faith is refined through the waiting, and God's timing is always perfect, even when we don't understand it.

The judge, described as neither fearing God nor caring for people, contrasts sharply with the heart of God, who is always just and merciful. This reinforces a core teaching of the Gospel: God is not distant or indifferent. He is a loving Father who delights in answering our prayers and delivering justice to His children.

The parable reminds us that persistence in prayer is key. It teaches us that, unlike the unjust judge, God is always ready to respond to our needs. Even when we feel as if He is silent, our faith and trust in His goodness must remain steadfast. He will answer us, not always in our time, but in His, and in the way that is best for us. Let us, be persistent like the widow, knowing that our prayers are never in vain.

This passage also invites us to examine our own faith: Do we trust in God's goodness even when answers seem delayed? Do we persist in prayer, not out of desperation but out of faith in His ultimate plan for us? The message is clear: God honours persistent faith, and He will bring justice, but it will come in His perfect timing.

2015 - 2025 the 10th Anniversary of our Parish

Earlier this year we mentioned that we would be preparing a book for the 10th Anniversary of our parish.

Thanks to the contributions of many parishioners, a book has now been prepared showing the 1st 10 years of the parish. A sample copy will be available for viewing on the welcome table.

After some fine tuning we will be looking to finally go to print using the diocese printing company. We will need a minimum order of 200 copies and then in increments of 50.

The pricing will be between \$25 and \$30, dependent on the size of the print run.

A signup sheet will be available where you can write your details and how many copies you would like to purchase.

Once we determine how many copies we need to print, it will be the only print run, so this book will be a 1st and last edition.


