Our Gospel this weekend takes place during a time of travel and teaching for Jesus. He would travel from place to place, teaching the people as he had the opportunity. And while he's doing that, someone in one of the crowds asks him a question, "Lord, are only a few going to be saved?" We're not really given any indication why this man is asking the question.

Jesus is telling us to pay attention to the GPS. But he's not talking about a road trip. He says we need to be focused on our goal of eternal life and the path to get there. If we're not really plugged in and paying attention, it's incredibly easy to take a wrong turn or try to get there by the wrong route. But, by God's grace, we will stay focused,

striving all of our life to enter through the narrow door.

In response to the earlier question from someone in the crowd, Jesus responds with the metaphor of the narrow door which is a reminder that salvation is not about taking the broad, comfortable path where there are no demands or challenges. It's about making deliberate choices to follow Christ, sometimes against the grain of societal pressures, personal desires, or temptations. It requires a genuine, personal relationship and commitment to living out God's will.

The passage challenges us to examine our own faith, calling us to a deeper, more authentic discipleship, and to broaden our understanding of God's kingdom,

which transcends human expectations and limitations.

It reminds us that salvation isn't just a matter of privilege but of sincere devotion to God's will.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM


Within the Catholic Diocese of Wollongong, an Emergency Response Plan (ERP)

MINISTRY OF THE TRIBUNAL

In 2015, Pope Francis wrote that "charity and mercy demand that the Church, like a good mother, be near her children who feel themselves estranged from her."

The Interdiocesan Tribunal of Sydney, which has an Office in the Diocese of Wollongong, is a service of the Church to assist with the pastoral care of Catholics and non-Catholics who are civilly divorced, and who are seeking to remarry or who want clarification of their standing in the Church. The Tribunal also assists remarried persons seeking to have their current marriage recognised in the Church, and remarried persons wishing to be baptised or received into the Catholic Church.

Any divorced person, or a divorced and remarried person is welcome to contact the Wollongong Office of the Tribunal to obtain further information, or to have their status within the Church clarified. Brochures are available from the church foyer or notice board area.

- 7. Care for God's creation






The Memorial of the Passion of Saint John the Baptist

(29 August Friday) complements the Solemnity of his birth, celebrated on 24 June. John is the cousin of Jesus. He was conceived when his parents, Zechariah and Elizabeth, were elderly. Both his parents were descendants of priestly families. John's birth took place about six months prior to that of Christ, and coincides with the Gospel episode of the Visitation of Mary to Elizabeth.

The liturgical celebration of his martyrdom, which occurred between 31 and 32, has ancient origins. It was already celebrated in France in the 5th century, and in Rome the following century and can be traced to the dedication of a small basilica that dates back to the 5th century where he was buried in Sabaste in Samaria. Tradition holds it was on this day that his head was found. Pope Innocent II had it later transferred to Rome to the Church of Saint Sylvester in Capite.

WILL POPE LEO XIV COME TO AUSTRALIA?

Prime Minister Anthony Albanese met with Pope Leo XIV at the Vatican in May 2025, extending a formal invitation for the pontiff to visit Sydney for the 2028 International Eucharistic Congress.

(Sydney was announced as the host city, making the 2028 Congress the first to be held in Australia since Melbourne in 1973)
