Sharing the sacred land of the Dharawal people, the parish of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop at Leppington and Oran Park is a family of diverse families.


We are sustained by the **Sacraments** and nurtured in our faith in **Jesus Christ.**

JOURNEY TO PENTECOST

If you are an adult Catholic who previously received the Sacrament of Baptism but missed First Holy Communion and/or Confirmation, consider joining us in preparing to receive these Sacraments.

In 2023 we will be adding a special process for adult 1st Holy Communion/Confirmation preparation to our Parish Calendar. This process, called 'Journey to Pentecost', will begin with an Enquiry Session on Tuesday 28 March 2023 (7.30pm-8.30pm) and see adult candidates receive the Sacraments of Confirmation and/or 1st Holy Communion at the Vigil Mass of Pentecost on Saturday, 27 May 2023.

ANOINTING MASS CHANGE OF DATE






Giving / Stewardship



ATTENTION CATHOLIC MEN!

A Vocation Open to ALL men – including married men. Permanent Diaconate Information Night!

As a parish we are blessed to have Deacon Sam Gennaoui minister alongside our Parish Priest Fr David as a member of our parish clergy.

Deacon Sam is a married man, who has been ordained to the permanent diaconate.



As our parish continues to exponentially grow, we are keen for more men to discern the vocation of permanent diaconate; and to specifically serve in our parish as permanent deacons.

Catholic men, and their wives if married, who are between the ages of 30 and 65 who are considering a possible vocation to the permanent diaconate (or who would like to find out more about the vocation of the permanent diaconate and the formation process to become a deacon) are invited to our inaugural **Parish Diaconate Vocation Awareness Night** that will be held at our Oran Park Church on Wednesday 22 March, 2023 from 7pm-9pm.

The 'agenda' for this evening will include: a time of prayer and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament (presided over by Deacon Sam), some sharing from Deacon Sam and Deacon Tony Hoban (National Chair – National Association of Deacons) on the vocation of the Permanent Diaconate (along with the foundational requirements for those wishing to discern this vocation) and a time for Q&A. The evening will conclude with supper.

Along with Deacon Sam and Deacon Tony, our Parish Priest Fr David and Fr Patrick Vaughan (who has been entrusted by Bishop Brian with accompanying diaconate enquirers for our Diocese) will be attending. Bring your questions and a heart open to the Lord's will. We invite you to please pass along this information if you know of any interested men or would like to encourage someone you know. Let us pray together for those men God is calling to become permanent deacons within our Parish.

ONLINE ENROLMENTS FOR 1st RECONCILIATION/1st HOLY COMMUNION OPEN ON MONDAY 6 MARCH

Those families who wish to present their children for the Sacraments of 1st Reconciliation/1st Holy Communion in 2023 are asked to complete the online enrolment form that will be available from **Monday**, 6 **March** through the

'Youth Sacraments' page on our parish website.

Online enrolments will close on Friday 17 March.

Also, just a reminder, only those who attend mass and/or reside within the Parish boundary of Oran Park are permitted to submit a sacramental enrolment form. (Please refer to the Parish website for the boundary map). Those who are parishioners of Camden, Varroville or Eagle Vale Parishes should complete sacramental preparations through their local Parish.

REMINDER OF HOW TO RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION

Those who have made 1st Holy Communion can receive Communion either in the hand or on the tongue.

Those who choose to receive Holy Communion in the hand <u>MUST</u> consume the host <u>IMMEDIATELY</u> in the presence of the minister.

- * Holy Communion cannot be taken back to their seat; and
- * Under no circumstances are they to give Holy Communion to a child or another person back at their seat.
