## EILEEN O'CONNOR PARISH RETREAT DAY

As many will recall, back in September (when he announced his diagnosis of metastatic prostate cancer) Fr David introduced many of us, for the first time, to Servant of God Eileen O'Connor, and he invited us to join with him in praying the novena to this woman, known as 'Little Mother' by the members of the congregation she founded.

As Fr David announced on the Easter Sunday weekend, our Parish is blessed to have been gifted a locket of Eileen O'Connor's hair. This locket – that some might say is a 'first class relic' of Eileen – is currently enshrined in a display case in our Oran Park Mass Centre, and, during his visit to our Parish for the 5pm Saturday Vigil Mass on Saturday 11 May, will be placed by Bishop Brian – next to the relic from the casket of St Mary MacKillop – into the Oran Park altar.

To allow us to get to know Eileen O'Connor – this 'saint-in-waiting' - a little bit more, Fr David is hosting a special retreat day on Tuesday 7 May. This retreat day (to be held at our Oran Park Mass Centre) will be facilitated by Monica O'Connell and Carlos Lopez (two lay people who work at Coogee with Eileen O'Connor's congregation 'Our Lady's Nurses for the Poor') The retreat day will begin with morning tea at 10am, and will include time for input and reflection, a 12.30pm Mass celebrated by Fr David, and conclude with lunch.
