We've all had the experience where we are at the supermarket or waiting in the security line at the airport. The lines are long and getting longer, and we are getting restless.

Suddenly a new line opens up and we rush to get into the new and shorter line. We try to get ahead of other people, perhaps deep down, we may think we're busier than they are!

It turns out we may not be too different from the people we met in Jesus' parable: guests at a dinner who felt they were more important than other guests, so important, in fact,

that they pushed ahead of others to claim places of honour.

In short - the message is about humbling ourselves before the Lord and when we do this, God will lift us up. The presence of Jesus at dinner in the Pharisee's home turned that event into a symbol of the heavenly banquet to which we've been invited. That banquet begins here and now in the celebration of the Eucharist where Jesus speaks to us through his Word and is present in the sacred Host.


The Gospel reminds us that we who are gathered around this Eucharistic table - the table of the Lord - the banquet of the Lord - we are reminded that regardless of our social status or wealth or power and importance we come to receive the Eucharist as brothers and sisters of equal standing before God.

It is the Eucharist we are about to receive - when bread becomes God.

When the exalted is humbled and the humble exalted.

We who are about to share in that mystery, in receiving that mystery are also exalted and humbled. Lord, I am not worthy that you should come under my roof. But he does. And we are transformed.

As we prepare to receive Christ in the appearance of bread, we pray to welcome him with humility - to answer in some small way Christ's invitation: "Come. Be my light." Deacon Sam



POPE GREGORY I,
COMMONLY KNOWN AS
ST. GREGORY THE GREAT

64th Bishop of Rome - 3 Sep 590 - 12 Mar 604. Famous for the emphasis he put on missionary work. He sent many people out to bring many to Jesus and into the Church. Anglo-Saxon Britain was, at that time, still on the frontier of Christendom. It was Pope Gregory who dispatched St. Augustine (of Canterbury) to Kent in 597.

He made many changes to the Mass, some of which remain today, The position of the Our Father in the Mass remains where Pope Gregory placed it.

ALBANIAN-INDIAN

CATHOLIC NUN &

MISSIONARY (1910-1997)

In 1950, Mother Teresa established the

Missionaries of Charity, a religious
congregation that was initially dedicated to
serving "the poorest of the poor" in the slums
of Calcutta. Over the decades, the
congregation grew to operate in over 133
countries, managing homes for those dying
from hiv/aids, leprosy, and tuberculosis, as
well as running soup kitchens, dispensaries,
mobile clinics, orphanages, and schools.

Members of the order take vows of chastity,
poverty, and obedience and also profess a
fourth vow: to give "wholehearted free
service to the poorest of the poor.



WHO IS THE FIRST PATRONESS OF AUSTRALIA?

Blessed Virgin Mary, venerated under the title of Mary Help of Christians. This title was chosen by the early Catholic community in Australia, specifically by Father John Therry and the people, for the Mother Church, making Australia the first nation in the world to adopt her as its principal patroness in 1844.

The feast of Mary Help of Christians is celebrated on May 24th, a date chosen to commemorate Pope Pius VII's return to Rome after imprisonment by Napoleon Bonaparte in 1814, which he attributed to Marys intercession.

The devotion was deeply rooted in the early colonial period when the Catholic community, often without priests, relied heavily on the Rosary for spiritual sustenance.

In addition to Mary Help of Christians, Australia also has a second patron saint,

St Mary of the Cross MacKillop, who was canonized in 2010 and is recognized as the first Australian saint
